

Bill Baugh reported that Leno's Law (sb 712) was dead. The DMV requirements for smog testing remain as before, all gasoline powered vehicles 1976 and newer require emissions testing, model year 1975 and older remain exempt from testing.

The Greatest Show on Turf will be held September 20 at the Recreation Center. He suggested that all vehicles should be pre-registered.

Bill shared that the All-American Car Show held on August 23, sponsored by the MOPAR Club, had 264 cars registered, with only one Pontiac at the show.

Sergio DaSilva attended the Sunset Cliffs Auto Show on August 23 and shared that it was a very good show.

Upcoming Activities

Dave Baker informed everyone that El Cajon Cruise Night has been extended through October. The rules remain the same.

J.C. reported on the Labor Day Swap Meet. He and David Baker held shop at the club's reserved spaces and passed out fliers for our car club. He explained that the purpose of having these spaces was to promote our SDPOCI club, enlist new members, and to give us a place to sell, swap or buy car parts, or other items that may be saleable.

This 1/16 scale aluminum P-51 model is completely hand made, was 3 years in the making and utilizes over 10,000 rivets.





RECREATING THE LOST "BLUE CAR"

CHAPTER 15



We are pleased to bring the next chapter of a series on Greg Raymond's restoration project to build a Tribute to the Royal Bobcat Blue Car from the March 1964 Car and Driver road test. This month's chapter highlights the paint and body work that is very close to completion! Amazing the detail and quality of workmanship Greg has undertaken to accurately replicate the Pilot Car that participated in the infamous C&D Road Test that jump-started GTO sales and the Muscle Car era!

I believe it's incredibly important to reflect on where you began, especially when that journey started nearly two years ago. The "Blue Car" was delivered to Patterson's Customs for paint and body on January 26th, 2024, and I'm thrilled to report that as I write this installment of "A Tribute to Jim Wangers' 1964 GTO 'Test Car' built for Car and Driver's March 1964 Road Test", we're finalizing the last of the panels.

The photo above shows our Pontiac, stripped down to sheet metal, being loaded onto a flatbed to begin its transformation. Over the past 21 months there hasn't been a single complaint, these guys elevated the project to an entirely new level, and for that, I'm deeply grateful.

Since a picture is worth a thousand words, I'll let the archive speak for itself. The body was completely stripped of paint. Remarkably rust-free, it only required a new trunk floor. But the level of detail throughout every phase was astonishing. The car was taken down to its 60-year-old sheet metal, and the backside of every panel was treated with POR-15. Every part of the car was acid washed, primed, sanded, sealed, re-sanded, primed, and sealed again.

Only after all that was color applied to what is the straightest GM A-body I have ever restored. When my father saw the restoration of his 1964 convertible, he said, "The car never looked that good even when it was new." I wish he were here to see this one. Next month, we begin assembly. Buckle up!... we're about to go fast.

Stripped! The commitment to remove all the paint including a mid 80's white repaint and the original Aquamarine Poly factory spray meant many hours of stripping and sanding. With every part of the car down to metal, we were delighted to see a very well preserved 1964 Pontiac with minimal need for body work.

Painted! There's just something mesmerizing about Pontiac's Nocturne Blue, a true feast for the eyes and notoriously difficult to capture on camera. These photos barely hint at its stunning depth and richness.



As mentioned earlier, the backside of nearly every panel was meticulously sanded, primed, sealed, and finished with a coat of POR-15, an essential step to ensure long-term protection against corrosion.

The only significant bodywork required was replacing the trunk floor. At some point in the car's history, a chemical spill had compromised that area. Thankfully, with a few replacement panels from Year One, we restored it to like-new condition.




Wake Up to Cars & Coffee at San Diego Automotive Museum Every 3rd Sunday of Month




