












1963 PONTIAC X-400



The highlight of the show was this 1963 Pontiac X-400 owned and shown by AZ Chapter member Bill Schoening. The X-400 was an experimental built for the GM show circuit by GM Styling Studio. One car was built each year for 1959, 1960, 1962, 1963 and 1964. The car had custom trim pieces and a special custom interior. This 1963 Pontiac X-400 was built out of a stock Catalina convertible. The X-400 had a supercharged 421 c.i. Pontiac engine originally built by racer Mickey Thompson. GM VP of styling Bill Mitchell supervised the design and construction of the '63 X-400. 













SAN DIEGO AUTO MUSEUM CARS AND COFFEE




