

If you wish to participate in the Christmas Gift Exchange:

Gift value from \$15 to \$25. No used items please.

No "gag" gifts.

Bring a gift for a woman if you are a female and a gift for a man if you are a male. Please add a gift tag to your package that indicates which gender the gift is for, male or female, gal or guy, man or woman. It is a secret who gives the gifts.

Gift must be wrapped.

Give the wrapped gift to Barbara Pluth and she will provide you with a number.

The gifts will be placed together in one staging area.

Rules of Play:

The lowest number will pick the gift they want and open it up for all to see.

The next number (person) will have the option to "steal" an open gift from another individual or pick a wrapped gift from the staging area.

This process will repeat until all the gifts have been opened.

No one gift can be stolen more than 2 times (the original person plus 2 steals). 3rd person to take possession has it for keeps (frozen).






Wake Up to Cars & Coffee at San Diego Automotive Museum Every 3rd Sunday of Month


