

ROLAND SHORT AND HIS 1971 GTO

In May of 1971 I turned 18 and graduated from Norman High School in Oklahoma. Soon after, I learned the draft had plans for me. To avoid the Army, I enlisted in the Navy in August and was off to boot camp in early October. I had a two-week leave from the Navy after boot camp and returned home for Christmas. There I learned my parent had sold their 58 Chevrolet I had been driving; but Dad had good news, he would cosign on a loan for any car except a 'Vette. December 21, 1971 I took ownership of the "Oklahoma White Goat". This was my name (Handle) in the Citizen Band (CB-Radio) world.

On December 26th, 1971 I left Norman, Oklahoma for Aviation Electrician School in Jacksonville, Florida. For the next 141,000 miles over 15 years, Oklahoma White Goat saw every part of my life including 2 years in Hawaii, multiple active and reserve duty stations in California, caught the eye of my wife and made her younger brothers think I was a "cool guy". The Goat took us on our honeymoon down the California coast, parked in the garage of my first (and only) house and brought our first child (Derek) home from the hospital.

My decision to sell the Goat is 1986 was hard, but necessary, as I had a young son that needed my time and resources. I remember struggling with the thought to sell or maintain. I had to sell as I did not have the time or finances to maintain the car as I desired; as it needed. She was purchased by Randy Smith from Silverdale, WA.

Randy and I stayed in contact over the years and in 1991 he called and asked me if I wanted to buy her back; he was selling due to health issues of his young son. By this time we had two young kids, I was going to college and doing reserve duty on weekends, and working 40 to 60 hours a week. I had no time or money to consider such an endeavor, but I did know who might be interested . . . My wife's younger brothers, who wish I would have told them when I sold it five years earlier. I made the call and within a couple of weeks both her younger brothers went to Washington and drove her back to California. Several years later one brother sold it to the other.

car had been started several times during those years. My brother-in-law and I took a battery out of his jeep and was able to start the Goat, but it would not move once it was in gear. Checked the transmission fluid - wasn't even on the stick. Added 3 quarts and it worked - backed it out of the garage, let it warm-up good and put it back in.

The following year that "young boy" who grabbed my time and attention 27 years ago, was at his Uncle's and I asked him to start it again; they did. After seeing the video he made and hearing the distinct exhaust noise, I had my first thought about what it would be like to have her back. It was just that, my personal thought - not shared but internal wondering. In October of 2013 my wife went to visit her brother for a long weekend. During this time her brother shared a financial need and wondered if I would want to buy the Goat back.

A few days after returning I was asking her how the Goat looked and she mentioned he would like to sell it back to me. Now I am putting my thought from months ago and her words together and thinking - maybe God is doing something here. We took a couple of weeks to discuss this more and to look at other commitments and plan how to do this financially. In November I sent the first payment and a note stating my intentions to purchase this by the end of 2014 - The White Goat is coming back to San Diego!

A little over a year later I have the car paid for and shipped to San Diego. I am lying in bed with the Goat sitting in my driveway. It is the early morning hours of December 19th, about 1 1/2 hours after taking delivery of the car (drove it maybe a mile), and I am recalling those feeling I had over 28 years ago when I had to sell her.

What a difference my feeling are now; what I am feeling now is what I wanted to feel over 28 years ago when I had to sell her. I begin to consider what had happened over the past 28 years:

- Raised 2 great kids
- Retired from the Navy Reserves
- Earned my Bachelor's Degree and have a career
- Have a wife committed to loving God and me
- Have friends that put up with me consistently.

When I look back at what I have been blessed with, I had to let the Goat go in 1986. What I have now is a blessing from God, the Goat is just a treat but not the focus of my life, and may it never be.

From May 1986 to December 2014, the Goat had 3 owners and was only driven 11,645 miles. I don't expect the original owner to be quite so frugal with the miles.

1948 Pontiac Station Wagon

arl Hooper of Orville Wright Junior High School in Westchester must have been one heck of a woodshop teacher. Ron Young, a retired Pomona school facilities manager, credits his eighth-grade instructor for imparting the skills he needed to restore the birch and mahogany body of his show-winning 1948 Pontiac woody wagon.

Resplendent in handcrafted, varnished brightwork, woodies were workhorses able to carry plenty of people and cargo. Primarily built from the 1920s through the 1940s, they were arguably the original SUVs. The intensive labor required to construct and maintain the wooden bodies caused woodies to lose favor with automakers and car buyers in the 1950s.

But in the 1960s, young Southern California surfers found inexpensive old woodies perfect for carrying their longboards to the waves, as memorialized in the song "Surfin' Safari" by the Beach Boys. "Growing up in Southern California, I dreamed of one day owning a woody," says Young. He completed the Pontiac's 7-year restoration in 2002. Today, Young displays his dream machine in parades, car shows, and charity events. "I enjoy seeing peoples' expressions when they see a wood-bodied car for the first time." Mr. Hooper would be proud of his former student's accomplishment.
