






RECREATING THE LOST 'BLUE CAR'

CHAPTER 2



We are pleased to bring Chapter 2 of a series on Greg Raymond's restoration project to build a Tribute to the Royal Bobcat Blue Car from the March 1964 Car and Driver road test, which was originally set to pit the first year Pontiac GTO against a true Ferrari GTO in both a drag race as well as on the track! Greg has done a tremendous amount of research on this Royal Bobcat prepared 1964 GTO including insider details Greg received directly from Jim Wangers and other notable Pontiacers. 
WHAT HAPPENED TO THE "BLUE CAR" - CHAPTER 2

"A Tribute to Jim Wangers' 1964 GTO 'Test Car' built for Car and Driver's March 1964 Road Test"

It's well documented that two Pontiac GTO's were provided by GM and used in **Car and Driver's** road test in Daytona Beach, Florida in late December 1963. I want to take a moment to introduce you to Tenney Fairchild, the current owner of the original "**Red Car**" used in the **Car and Driver** Road Test. Tenney's father, Phil, was a copywriter who worked at McManus, John and Adams with Jim Wangers. Tenney states; "I got

to ride in this car when I was a kid," Tenney Fairchild says, gently pulling the duster across the hood of his red 1964 GTO. "I was four years old, and the car was brand-new. I remember smelling the oil and the exhaust. I remember trying to peer over the hood to look at the engine. This car is the reason I'm obsessed with cars."

Special-ordered and prepared by Jim, Fairchild's Grenadier Red GTO left the factory with the Tri-Power 389, M-20 four-speed, and 3.23 gears. But that's not how it was configured when it arrived at Daytona. Instead, Jim built it into a "ringer."

To save weight, he had it built without sound insulation or seam sealer. Then Jim had Pontiac engineering swap its 389 for a 421 H.O. from the larger Catalina, along with a close-ratio M-21 four-speed and 3.90 gears. The swap fooled everyone, including the editors of Car and Driver. Jim didn't reveal the truth to anyone until his memoir was published in 1998.

"So the magazine guys wouldn't get suspicious, he equipped the car with a few options including power steering, a power antenna, and the fancy hubcaps," says Fairchild. "He wanted it to look like a regular GTO any dealer might have in stock." *

WHAT HAPPENED TO THE "BLUE CAR" - CHAPTER Z

"A Tribute to Jim Wangers' 1964 GTO 'Test Car' built for Car and Driver's March 1964 Road Test"

At some point during testing, "The Red Car" suffered a blown engine. The article goes on to report; "He [Jim Wangers] flat-towed it home behind "The Blue Car" and had Royal Pontiac install a fresh 421. The red car would become his [Jim's] daily driver and Woodward Avenue racer until the following August when it went back to Royal and was quickly sold to Royal Oak police officer Bill Sherman for \$3200.

By the time Joe Conte, a New Jersey Corvette collector, bought the GTO in 1991, it was a rusty old drag car with a heavily modified and incorrect 428. But Conte was aware of the car's history and stored it safely. Then Fairchild came calling. "I emailed Conte in the late 1990s and continued to check in periodically," he says. "I was finally able to buy the car in 2005."

The photos in the **Car and Driver** article include the engine bay of "**The Red Car**" with the rest of the photos being of the "Pilot Car," better known as "**The Blue Car**." After discussing this with Tenney Fairchild, we agreed that this was likely due to two factors, the first being **Car and Driver** along with most magazines in the early sixties were predominantly printed in Black and White. The contrast of the darker Nocturne Blue GTO would present better in the monochromatic print environment. But it's more likely due to it being the Pilot car.

Pilot cars are preproduction cars built before the start of the model year. They were used for testing and to verify that everything works as designed. This is significant because Pilot cars are built slower with the attention of everyone in the plant, and typically, under the scrutinous eyes of the engineers responsible for the new model. Tenney went on to explain that "**The Blue Car**" was a hand made car and for that reason was incredibly well detailed.

There were also some omissions as well. The heavy duty jute padding was not installed under the carpet, and as you can see in the photo, no side view mirrors were installed on the car.

But what happened to "The Blue Car?" The answer is a sad one. As a preproduction vehicle, Pilot cars have no Vehicle Identification Number, and as a result, GM could not legally sell cars that are used and abused through any sort of performance or durability testing. So sadly, "The Blue Car," after it had valiantly flat towed the broken red GTO 1500 miles back to Michigan and headed off to it's final resting spot as one of the two most significant GTO's ever built... was crushed.
