February 18--San Diego Auto Swap Meet at the Chula Vista Cricket Wireless Amphitheater. JC said he bought two spaces for use by club members. Other spots are free to participants on a first come, first serve basis. Greg will give a report at the next meeting.

March 1-3—Midnight at the Oasis, Yuma, AZ. JC said it's a great event. Hotels give good discounts. The entry fee is \$135 for two people which includes evening concerts, a Friday reception meal, Saturday luncheon and Sunday brunch.

March 15-17—Las Vegas. Greg said there's a new All Pontiac Class at the "Muscle Cars at The Strip" this year.

March 30—Roland Short said he is planning a cruise along Highway 80 to Buckman Springs, then over to Campo. Participants are asked to meet at the McDonald's at Los Coches Road and Interstate 8 (13574 Camino Canada, El Cajon). The cruise will begin at 9 am, arriving at Campo at 10 am. Everyone can visit the museums, meet for lunch at noon at the Campo Café, then head back home on Highway 94.

Racing Reports

Greg reported that JBA is sponsoring muscle cars in Las Vegas at the "Muscle Cars at The Strip, March 15-17. Austin Bittle will be racing Dominator Wide Body Mustang at the Las Vegas Speedway at this open show. Greg will report back to the club after the event.

New Business:

Bill Baugh reported that Legislative Directive SB 961 proposes that all new 2027 vehicles built or sold will be equipped with a monitor that electronically limits the speed of the vehicle to prevent the driver from exceeding the speed limit by more than 10 miles per hour (an intelligent speed limiter system). He asked members to look on the SEMA website where all legislative proposals are listed. It also provides a link to email California representatives and express opposition to this bill.

Bill said the Car Club Council meets every other month at different locations, from 5-7 pm, and everyone is invited to attend. The next meeting, April 2, will be held at Jane's Classic Malt Shop on Midway Drive in Point Loma Plaza.

Bill referred everyone to the San Diego Association of Car Club website. The calendar lists all car shows. Just click on the date and you'll find all pertinent information related to the event.

Roland asked how many members were in the club. JC said there were 30, per Geoff. Membership dues are \$25 for one person, \$35 for couples.










RECREATING THE LOST 'BLUE CAR'

CHAPTER 3



We are pleased to bring Chapter 3 of a series on Greg Raymond's restoration project to build a Tribute to the Royal Bobcat Blue Car from the March 1964 Car and Driver road test, which was originally set to pit the first year Pontiac GTO against a true Ferrari GTO in both a drag race as well as on the track! Greg has done a tremendous amount of research on this Royal Bobcat prepared 1964 GTO including insider details received directly from Jim Wangers and other notable Pontiacers. "A Tribute to Jim Wangers' 1964 GTO 'Test Car' built for Car and Driver's March 1964 Road Test"

Where do you even start when considering to build a "Tribute to Jim Wangers" lost Pilot car used in the 1964 Car and Driver test? Put aside locating a PHS documented GTO to sacrifice for the cause. The value of any and all documented Pontiac GTO's has hit the point where it would be sacrilegious to modify one in any way. The impact to the value, due to the modifications needed for this build, would likely diminish the GTO's value as a result. As an owner of an original 1964 Pontiac GTO convertible that was ordered in December of 1963 by my father, and delivered to him in April of 1964, I am staunchly against the conversion of any Tempest or Le Mans into a GTO for the intension of passing it off as the real McCoy.

That being said, building a tribute car with 100% transparency to the mission at hand made the best option one that literally fell into my lap. Long time SDPOCI Member Terry Saunders had reached out to me several times throughout the past few years in an effort to sell his 1964 Pontiac LeMans 2 Door Sport Coupe. I would always push back with the hope that he would complete his 25 year long project. Last year Terry once again reached out. Having recently purchased a new home, he simply had to move the car and all of the parts which had been meticulously removed, bagged, and tagged. It was at this moment in April of 2023 that I gave in.

Terry had put the time in on this project. He stripped off 90% of its original parts. A stout 389ci engine sat on an engine stand next to the Le Mans ready to breath life back into the classic Pontiac. He truly spent 100's of hours working on the car in pursuit of his vision. So it was time to get this Pontiac back on the road, and what better way than as a tribute to Jim Wangers lost pilot car... "The Blue Car."

The photos below were taken in 1999 as Terry began the process of dismantling the 1964 LeMans to prepare it for glory. Despite the frightening condition the photos illustrate due to its the many layers of paint applied over 60 years, it looked far worse than it was. In an upcoming chapter we will get a good look at how well preserved this Pontiac was as we bring it all the way down to the metal creating the perfect surface for "The Blue Cars" Nocturne Blue finish.

I owe some credit to Dave Anderson, my long time colleague and friend who I was lucky enough to work along side with for both Jim Wangers and Art Fitzpatrick for the better part of twenty years on various projects. While attending the 33rd annual All-Pontiac Show in Fullerton, CA in May of 2023, I let Dave in on my plan. At the time I was planning to build "The Red Car." Dave, without hesitation; "Greg, you gotta build the blue car. It's gone!" He couldn't have made more sense. "Why build another version of a car that is already restored and showing? So here we are today building the long lost "Blue Car." Thanks Dave!

"A Tribute to Jim Wangers' 1964 GTO 'Test Car' built for Car and Driver's March 1964 Road Test"

So with a couple days of hard labor, the 1964
LeMans Sport Coupe was on a trailer and the keys were
in my hand. Before spending any time on paint and body,
the initial task was to put together a plan for the most
"correct" engine combination. There was much debate
as to what was "correct." There is very little information
on the pilot car. No PHS documentation exists. So I
polled all the "smart guys" in our hobby and came to the
following conclusions.



Starting with the Car and Driver Article:

"This was the most exhaustive and thorough road test we have ever done. We used two nearly-identical cars, the differences being that one car had the shorter-ratio manual steering [The Red Car] while the other had power [The Blue Car]; the manual steering car was also equipped with metallic brake linings. We drove our two cars unmercifully. One was driven from Detroit to New York City, used for ten days by every member of the staff, then driven from New York to Daytona Beach, Florida carrying the managing editor, his wife, and three active children. This car—the manual steering, metallic brake version [The Red Car]—was driven over 3000 miles. The other car [The Blue Car] was driven about 500. We ran dozens of acceleration tests on the two cars, plus many, many laps of the Daytona International Raceway's tri-oval and road circuit." "Our test cars were Bobcats."

In Jim Wangers Glory Days:

"We agreed to supply two Pontiac GTO's, one a stock Sports Coupe with standard suspension, a 348 horsepower Tri-Power engine, a wide-ratio 4-speed gearbox, and a limited-slip 3.55:1 rear end. We chose to use a "pilot line car," thus it had no production VIN number. That car, known as "The Blue Car" since it was painted Nocturne Blue."

From those who know far more than I:

There was some debate. Debate that ran from "The Blue Car" having a stock 389ci Tri-Power and not getting a 421ci engine from Royal Pontiac all the way to it being a 4bbl car. We interviewed all the key players that still bless us with Pontiac knowledge and devised a reasonable and logical build that took into consideration what we all know as fact, blended with what we had to make assumptions on. While all involved agree that with the C-pillar Royal Bobcat badging and Royal Pontiac license plate frame as seen in the Car and Driver article photos, along with the fact that the pilot car was built at the plant a mere 11 miles south of Ace Wilson's Royal Pontiac via Woodward Ave., that it most definitely made many trips to Royal Pontiac before its trek to Florida in December of 1963. Next month we will open the hood on "The Blue Car's" final engine plan!



Keeping The Pontiac Legacy Alive...

Formed in 1972 by a small group of enthusiasts who wanted to pool as much Pontiac and Oakland information as was possible, the first convention was held the following year in Camp Hill, Pennsylvania. Since then, POCI chapters have formed all over the country and POCI Conventions have been held every year in a variety of locations. The events include a car show, tech seminars, presentations, drag racing and a great swap meet. GMC trucks were included in 1998, due to their close relation to Pontiac.

The club's magazine, *Smoke Signals*, also started in 1972 and has evolved into a world-class, award-winning monthly that continues to raise the bar for non-commercial publications. *Smoke Signals* was redesigned in 2006 and again in 2013. 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

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
